

EcoMujer, WECF and WLOE e.V. call for women's action for climate justice on Saturday, June 5, 2010, in Bonn, Germany

From May 31st to June 11, 2010, a climate conference in Bonn, Germany will prepare for the next big climate summit meeting, to be held in Mexico in December 2010. Given the lack of political action in Copenhagen, a "Climate Wave" alliance formed. Among other activities it is calling for a **demonstration on June 5th** (World Environment Day) from 13-15:00 to **take a stand for climate protection and climate justice.**

We want to participate in this demonstration with a women's presence **because climate/environmental issues are intrinsically related to issues of gender justice.**

Climate change increases inequalities between countries and also between genders. While women and men contribute differently to creating climate change, they also suffer its impact differently. The effects of climate changes are especially noticeable in areas that define the life of women in many regions on earth and where women must take on responsibilities for food security, health, water, and energy supplies. Women are also particularly affected by natural disasters, whereas they are rarely involved in climate policy decisions.

On June 5th we as women can make ourselves seen and heard! This joint action provides the opportunity to meet people already active in this area and people who want to get involved.
