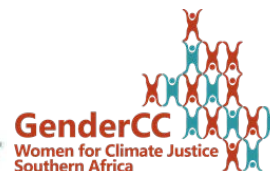
## Point of departure

- ▶ IPCC Working Group II Co-Chair Debra Roberts: "Growing urbanization and climate change create complex risks, especially for those cities that already experience poorly planned urban growth, high levels of poverty and unemployment, and a lack of basic services".
- ▶ With growing urbanisation, inequalities tend to increase
- ▶ Climate change impacts and responses affect people differently, depending on social factors like age, race, social status, gender etc.
- ▶ Yet, approaches to integrate gender into urban climate policy are still lacking

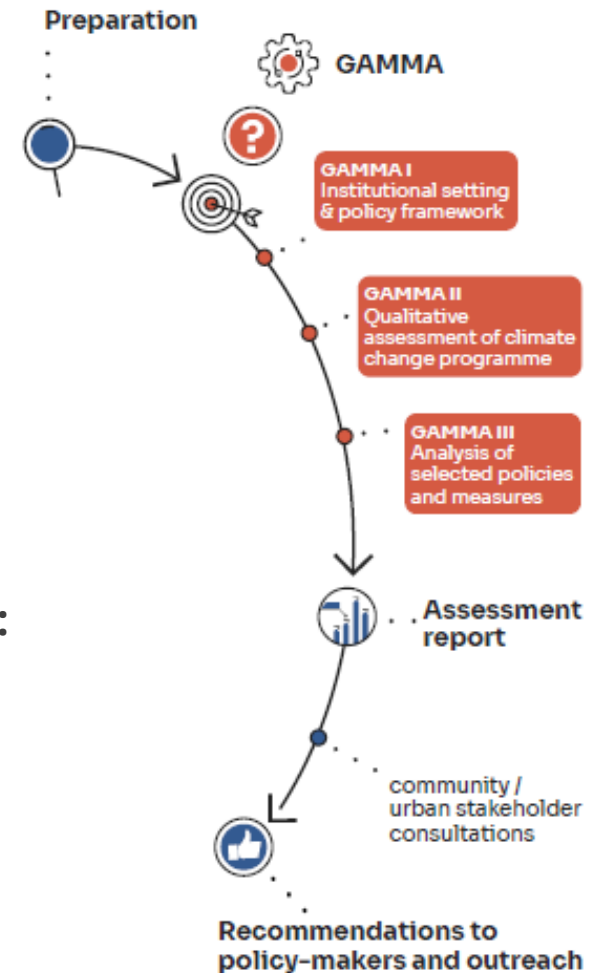
# Gender into Urban Climate Change Initiative to develop a gender-responsive approach

- ▶ Train women's organisations and community groups on climate change
- ▶ Develop gender analysis method GAMMA for urban climate policies
- ▶ Apply GAMMA at urban levels to develop recommendations and pilot projects for gender-responsive urban climate action
- ▶ Work strategically with urban communities and policy-makers
- ▶ Monitor outcomes



# Gender Assessment and Monitoring of Mitigation and Adaptation methodology (GAMMA)

- ▶ **Assessment of the institutional and procedural framework:**  
*Are urban institutions and procedures suited to address climate change and integrate the gender dimension?*
- ▶ **Assessment of urban climate action programmes:**  
*What are priority strategies from a gender perspective?  
Does the climate action programme cover these fields of action?*
- ▶ **Gender Analysis of selected policies and measures:**  
*How can policies and measures be improved in order to avoid adverse impacts on gender equality and rather contribute to gender equality?*



# Achievements and outputs during 2016–2021

- ▶ **GAMMA applied in 14 pilot cities**
- ▶ **Practical projects implemented with local communities**
- ▶ **Capacity-building, advocacy and monitoring**
- ▶ **GAMMA adapted and tested to be applied at national and regional levels**
- ▶ **Policy recommendations for urban, national and international levels developed, incl linkages with the responses to the pandemic**
